the radio and through social media posts.

Bizzarro said one of his main goals in his campaign efforts was to remind people that there is an election this Tuesday where their voices will be heard if they go out to vote. Bizzarro, who is opposed to the proposed tolls in Connecticut, said that this election gives residents a unique opportunity to tell the legislature how they feel about the proposed budget and the approach the governor is taking.

"Residents of the 6th District: Get out and vote tomorrow, Tuesday, February 26. Let your voice be heard. Say no to tolls, new taxes, and out of control spending policies," Bizzarro said Monday through a Facebook post.

Lopes said that he was also out campaigning the last few days. Lopes and his team knocked on doors in the district, made phone



calls and sent out mail. "We prioritized talking to the voters," Lopes said.

Lopez also promoted his campaign on social media sites.

"I am running to represent New Britain, Berlin, and Farmington in the Connecticut State Senate because I understand the needs and problems that the hard-working people of this community face-I face them myself," Lopez said on a Facebook post.

Lopes said one of his concerns is that the community is not always active in coming out to vote.
